- Arrive at school at 8.40am ready for the day ahead.
- Only leave school with the authorised adult and to alert staff if that adult is not present .

# Safety and Well Being

## The school will:

- Complete the annual Data Collection sheet including emergency contact information and daily collection arrangements.

- Ensure the gate shuts when you enter and leave the site and report to the office if you come on site after 9:00am.
- Keep children at home for 48 hours after the last bout of sickness and diarrhoea.

# Learning

## The school will:
