

Evidencing the Impact of Primary PE and Sport Premium provided 2016-2017

Vision for the Primary PE and Sport Premium

ALL pupils leaving primary school **physically literate** and with the **knowledge, skills and motivation** necessary to equip them for a **healthy, active lifestyle** and **lifelong participation** in physical activity and sport.

The sports premium funding has been provided to ensure impact against the following **OBJECTIVE:** To achieve self-sustaining improvement in the quality of PE and sport in primary schools.

It is expected that schools will see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

1. the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
2. the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
3. increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
4. broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
5. increased participation in competitive sport

During the financial year 2016-2017 Shottery Primary received £8305 of Sports Premium Funding. The funding was been set aside to fund the hire of premises to enable sporting experiences, the contracting of specialist staff to provide additional physical education experiences above and beyond the National Curriculum and the hire of additional coaches/ provision to assist the school in its application for the School Games Bronze Mark.



During the year all children have had opportunity to take part in Forest school experiences and children in Year 2-6 have been offered a number of extra curricular clubs including football, running, netball, unihoc and country dancing.

Participation at sports clubs has increased and children enthused to take part. Children have also been motivated to extend and increase their physical activity to

lunchtimes and have fundraised themselves to provide additional equipment to support break and lunchtime physical activity.



Children have also had the opportunity to take part in the Southern Warwickshire Indoor Athletics tournament with additional coaching to support as well. Additionally pupils have had the opportunity to take part in local football tournaments, quad kids and the schools' swimming gala whilst individual pupils have taken part in cross country events.



We came second in the Small Schools Indoor Athletics Tournament in the Spring term.

We have also worked in partnership with local organisations for example Stratford Leisure Centre and Stratford Hockey Club.

Committed spend 2017/18

The increased funding for 2017/18 of £16,760 will continue to enable our school to provide high quality sporting opportunities and increased provision. We have already committed and in some cases carried out the following opportunities/ spend.

- Hire of Premises
- Transport costs for PE/ Sporting experiences
- Subsidised outward bound residential
- Free After school multi-sport club led by specialist coach
- Autumn Term Fit for Life Day
- Club/ tournament membership and entry fees

Other Anticipated spend 2017/18

- In line with the number of pupils cycling/ scootering to school we will seek to purchase additional bike and scooter storage.
- Additional Fit for Life Days, following the success of the Autumn Term day.
- Forest School experiences
- Specialist coaches
- Lunchtime sports provision

Swimming and water safety

In line with requirements we provide swimming instruction in either key stage 1 or key stage 2, such that if pupils are with us for the whole of their primary education they will be taught to swim. During those sessions pupils are taught to:

- swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres
- use a range of strokes effectively [for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke]
- perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.

Pupils in our current Year 6 have already had the opportunity to swim as Year 3 pupils and will have a further swimming course during the summer term. At this point a final competency assessment will be made.
